## What to Do:

**Bowhead Whale** This whale is found in the <u>Arctic Ocean</u>. Small numbers are <u>hunted by Eskimos</u>. It is <u>Endangered</u>, but its <u>population is increasing</u>.

N. Atlantic Right Whale This whale is found in the Atlantic Ocean along the coast. It got its name from whalers because it was the "<u>right whale to kill</u>". It is <u>Endangered</u>, and its <u>population is going down</u>. It is protected from whaling.

<u>Blue Whale</u> This whale is found in all <u>oceans worldwide</u>/ offshore. It is <u>Endangered</u>, but its <u>population is going up</u>. Its is protected from whaling. The <u>largest animal to have ever lived</u>.

<u>Minke Whale</u> This whale is found in all <u>oceans worldwide</u>. Found along the coast. It is <u>not endangered</u>, but it <u>still being hunted by Japan</u>, Iceland and Norway. The population is <u>stable</u>.

<u>Fin Whale</u>. This whale is found offshore in all oceans. It is <u>endangered</u>, but the <u>population is increasing</u>. <u>Second largest whale on earth</u>. Protected from whaling.

<u>Humpback Whale</u> – This is a <u>coastal</u> whale and is found <u>world-wide</u>. It has recovered from whaling. However, some populations are <u>endangered</u>. <u>Population is increasing</u> and it is protected from whaling. A recording was made of Humpback sounds, called "<u>Songs</u> <u>of the Humpback Whale</u>"

<u>Gray Whale is a coastal</u> whale. It is <u>rarely seen a mile from shore</u>. Found only in the <u>North Pacific Ocean</u>. It has fully recovered from whaling and is not endangered. <u>Population is stable.</u>
